

OH JESUS, WHAT WOULD HAVE BECOME OF ME IF YOU HAD NOT DRAWN ME TO THEE?

A Minute with the Deacon Jesus enters the house of Peter

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, In today's Gospel passage from Mark 1:29-39, we witness the profound ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ as he moves from the synagogue to the home of Simon and Andrew. The events that unfold in this passage teach us valuable lessons about the essence of discipleship and the call to serve. As the narrative begins, Jesus enters the house of Simon and Andrew. Simon's mother-in-law lies ill with a fever, and Jesus, filled with compassion, takes her by the hand

and raises her up. In this simple yet powerful gesture, we see the healing touch of our Lord, a touch that not only restores physical health but also symbolizes the transformative power of God's grace in our lives. The healing of Simon's mother-inlaw is a vivid reminder that Jesus is not distant or indifferent to our sufferings. He enters into the intimate spaces of our lives, addressing our ailments and infirmities with the healing balm of his love. As disciples of Christ, we are called to open our homes and hearts to the presence of the Lord, allowing Him to bring healing and restoration to our lives. However, the story doesn't end there. The news of Jesus' miraculous healing spreads throughout the town, and by evening, the whole city gathers at the door. People from all walks of life, burdened by various afflictions, seek the touch of Jesus. And what does our Lord do? He responds to their needs with unwavering compassion, curing the sick and casting out demons. In this, we find a crucial lesson for us as disciples: the call to serve. Jesus didn't confine his ministry to the synagogue or a select few; instead, he went out to the people, meeting them where they were in their struggles and pain. As followers of Christ, we are called to emulate this outreach, to go beyond the comfortable confines of our faith communities and actively engage with the world, bringing the light of Christ to those in darkness. Moreover, as the Gospel unfolds, we see Jesus rising early in the morning and going to a deserted place to pray. This highlights the necessity of communion with God through prayer. In the midst of our busy lives, it is crucial to follow the example of Jesus and seek moments of solitude to deepen our relationship with the Father. The passage concludes with Jesus proclaiming, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." This final statement encapsulates the mission of Christ and, by extension, our mission as his disciples. We are called not only to receive God's grace and healing but also to share it with others, to go out into the world and proclaim the message of love, redemption, and salvation. As we reflect on this Gospel passage, let us embrace the call to serve, seek the presence of Christ in our lives, and respond to the needs of our brothers and sisters with compassion. May we, like Jesus, be a source of healing and hope in the world, actively engaging in the mission of proclaiming the Good News to all.

and immediately heals Peter's mother, who is ill. He makes her well with only a touch. In a short period of time after he begins his public life, he reveals his wisdom of scripture, his command over demons and his great compassion for those who are suffering. He's showing himself to be the long awaited Messiah. Throughout the remainder of Mark's gospel this weekend, there are many that come to Jesus for healing. Jesus turns no one away. However, he also shows the importance of setting aside time to

pray in solitude to his Father renewing his own strength and energy. In this week's gospel, we see how important it is for us to stay close to Jesus in our own lives. He offers us the same healing and renewal that he offered to those in Mark's gospel today, if we only approach him in humility, faith and hope.
